## OUR ACTIONS

The protection of our fragile environment is at the forefront of everything we do. Here's an overview of what is important to us all on Milaidhoo.

### **Clean by design**

Our state-of-the-art water and sewage treatment plant ensures that no contaminants ever enter the ocean. Treated greywater is repurposed wherever possible, helping us reduce waste and protect marine life.

### **Eco-friendly housekeeping**

We use only accredited, environmentally safe chemicals in our laundry and cleaning services. Due to the harsh environmental impact of traditional solvents, we do not offer dry cleaning.

### **Built with care**

Before construction began, we conducted a comprehensive environmental impact assessment. Every guideline and recommendation has been meticulously followed to safeguard the island's delicate ecosystem.

### **Helping coral rebuild**

Our coral regeneration programme invites guests to take part in reef restoration by "adopting" and planting a coral frame – an experience that creates a lasting legacy beneath the waves.

### **A shared responsibility**

Every member of the Milaidhoo Family is educated in sustainable practices and takes a personal pledge to protect our natural environment, ensuring that our ethos of care extends to every corner of the island.

### **Respecting the law, raising the bar**

We fully comply with all local environmental laws and regularly update our practices to meet – and exceed – those standards.

### **Cutting out plastic**

At Milaidhoo, we are committed to reducing plastic usage by providing glass water bottles and utilising sustainable packaging for villa amenities.



With over 200 family members with a diverse background of different nationalities, majority Maldivian, we encourage and support the career development of each member.

#### **Recycling where it matters**

We have strategically placed recycle bins in back-of-house areas, including facilities like a bottle crusher and incinerator, to manage waste efficiently.

#### **Smart energy use**

We implement energy-saving measures such as switching off lights when not in use, controlling air conditioning, and using energy-efficient bulbs.

#### **Low-waste living**

Our villas and residences are designed with minimal printed collateral to reduce paper waste.

#### **Composting and waste management**

We practice food composting by processing food waste every second day, while the remaining waste is sent to Malé for recycling.

#### **Clean shores, clear waters**

Our dedicated team members regularly engage in lagoon and beach cleaning activities to maintain our pristine environment.

#### **Fresh, local, sustainable**

Our chef's garden and nursery prioritise locally sourced produce, ensuring fresh ingredients on our menus.

#### **Giving back to the community**

We actively support the local community and charities on nearby islands through various initiatives and contributions.

#### **Eco-friendly housekeeping**

Guests are given the option to change linens and towels every other day, promoting sustainable practices.

#### **Quiet adventures**

To preserve the peacefulness of our environment, we favour non-motorised options for lagoon and aquatic activities.
